### \*\* FLAT RENTS FOR 2020 \*\*

Please see the attached flyers with information regarding the new flat rents for 2020. If you currently do not pay the flat rent this increase will not affect you. This only applies to those tenants who pay the flat rent, for these tenants the increase will be effective with your next annual recertification, if at that time your tenant rent amount is greater than the flat rent for your unit size.

### **Snow Removal & Salt**

The AHA removes snow from roads, parking lots and major walkways after snowfalls. Tenants in the Garden Apartments are responsible for clearing the sidewalks, ramps & steps leading from their apartments to the main walkways. Salt is available to residents' weekdays between 7:00 am to 3:00pm. Hi Rise and Garden Apartment tenants can obtain salt at the rear entrance of the High Rise; salt for Stratton tenants is available in the Stratton lobby.



### **Power & Cable Outages**

When the power or cables goes out, please understand that it is out of the control of the Amsterdam Housing Authority. We must be patient and wait for National Grid or Spectrum to fix the problem. If we are notified that the power or cable will be out for an extended period, we will do our best to keep you informed. Also, when the power/cable is out our office phones do not work, you may hear it ringing on your end, but we are not able to receive the call on our end. If you leave us a message with your name and phone number, we will return your call when our system goes back up



# IMPORTANT - Winter Parking

Vehicle towing during winter season -

It is important to register your vehicle with the office! Any resident who owns a vehicle and wishes to park in any AHA parking lots is required to register their vehicle with the administrative office. Please stop in to the office to obtain your vehicle sticker. There is NO cost for the sticker. Any vehicle that is parked in one of AHA's parking lots that is not registered, WILL BE TOWED. This is necessary in order to insure the maximum level of safety for all residents who will need to utilize the parking lots this winter. Having to plow around vehicles creates a safety hazard with the excess snow that is left in the parking lot. Beginning this year all unregistered vehicles will be towed on the morning of snowstorms.

Any cars parked in the fire lanes will be towed without warning, at the car owners' expense. Maintenance needs to be able to access these areas in order to plow our parking lots.

Please be cooperative during snow removal. Please move your vehicles to cleared areas so that the maintenance staff can plow the parking lots more effectively.

To All Amsterdam Housing Authority Residents:

The Amsterdam Housing Authority Board of Commissioners has approved our request for a "flat rent" increase. This increase will take effect as of January 1, 2020 but you will not see the increase until your <u>next yearly recertification</u>.

We are required by HUD to establish flat rents at no less than 80% of the fair market rent. The current flat rents are below the threshold recommended. Therefore, in order to be compliant, the flat rents will be increasing. Please refer to the chart below for the new flat rents.

# PHADA'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

In order to encourage academic excellence and community responsibility among high school students, PHADA has implemented a scholarship program for graduating seniors who are preparing to enter college. PHADA will award three (3) scholarships to deserving youth currently residing in a PHADA member agency.

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Steve Bollinger (April 11, 1948–June 18, 1984) was a taskmaster to himself, a human dynamo to those who knew him. He was a natural leader, a person who could rally people around him with wit, satire, and vocal exercises. Steve's knowledge of and dedication to housing those in need was never absent, especially after he was appointed Assistant Secretary for Community Planning and Development at HUD. His experience at the Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority and the associations he had with colleagues, mayors, and others afforded him the opportunity to deal with the bureaucracy in a style that we strive to attain. To the members of PHADA, he was a friend. His belief in the housing profession motivated him to become a founding member of PHADA, for which he served as Vice President. He accomplished much in a short time and we are all thankful for his achievements. PHADA created this scholarship to memorialize Stephen J. Bollinger.

This scholarship will be formally presented at PHADA's Annual Convention and Exhibition on June 2, 2020, in Denver, CO. The winner will receive a trip for him/herself and one parent/guardian to attend the convention.






